

Field to Forest

The regenerative ability of nature will be examined in the context of various human activities such as forestry, agriculture and urban development. Though this program is most appropriate to the Grade 7 science curriculum, it can be adapted to suit curricula in Grade 4 (Habitats) and Grade 6 (Diversity).

Curriculum outcomes that can be addressed through this program include: Grade 3 “Plant Growth and Changes” and “Soils”, Grade 4 “Habitats”, Grade 6 “Diversity” and Grade 7 “Interactions within Ecosystems”.
